Saddle Up!

Join us for a fantastic horseback adventure just 1 mile west of Big Timber. Ride along the renowned Yellowstone River among the mighty cottonwoods. Experience a true Montana cattle and sheep ranch. Customize your ride to include a picnic lunch along the Yellowstone River. ABO's guides are experienced, knowledgeable and personable. Treat yourself to a great adventure!

2-hour horseback rides on Yellowstone ranches- \$95 per person minimum 2 people
BYOL (bring your own lunch) rides- \$125 (usually adds 30-45 minutes to the ride)

Custom rides and riding lessons available upon request.

For private property owners: We can trailer horses to your ranch for your family & guests to enjoy a guided horseback ride. Great for weddings & special events! (minimum of 6 people). Horse rides available year-round, weather permitting

Saddle & Paddle - \$170 per person minimum 2 people - Includes 2-hour morning horseback ride & 2-hour early afternoon float trip on the Yellowstone River. The trip allows time between the raft and the ride for lunch on your own in Big Timber

From Bozeman take Interstate 90 to Big Timber. Take the 1st Big Timber Exit and go left under I 90 to the light. *

From Billings take I 90 to Big Timber. Take the 2nd Big Timber Exit and go right to the light.*

***At the light turn left on the frontage road.** You will be heading west. Go approximately one mile. Turn right the first place you can cross the railroad tracks. Cross the railroad tracks and follow the ranch road to the brown barn.
